

Tuff Tray-Benefits in Early Childhood Education

Tuff Tray activities are a versatile resource that promotes various types of play, including social, creative, sensory, and role play. They can be easily adapted based on the child's learning direction or transformed into a new activity

Every Tuff Tray setup should offer possibilities for learning and development, whether intended or arising during play. Here are some examples of learning that may take place:

Personal, Social, and Emotional Development:

Tuff Trays provide opportunities for independent exploratory play, helping children develop a sense of self. They also promote social play, teaching children how to interact, socialize, and collaborate.

Communication and Language Development

An engaging Tuff Tray setup sparks exploration and curiosity, opening up many opportunities for interaction. From babies to pre-schoolers, children can interact with others during Tuff Tray play, promoting critical thinking and language learning.

Physical Development:

Tuff Trays encourage children to strengthen their fine motor skills by providing different tools, objects, and materials. Gross motor skills can also be developed by encouraging children to move around the tray.

Specific Areas of Learning:

Tuff Tray play supports learning and development in Mathematics, Literacy, Understanding the World, and Expressive Arts and Design. By exploring and experimenting in Tuff Trays, children start to grasp new concepts and develop a sense of the world around them.

Sensory Development:

Tuff Trays are an excellent way to contain sensory bases, such as rice, pasta, mud, water, and more. The sensory elements immerse children, stimulating their five senses and allowing them to explore and be creative.



Loos parts play- obstacle course







An obstacle course is one of the most simple yet effective ways to make use of outdoor loose parts! They used a variety of sized cable drums, planks, crates, and tyres to create a sturdy and adventurous balancing beam.

This not only supported the children in developing their physical skills, balance and coordination, but allowed them to explore risk and creativity. Engaging in "risky play" allows children to understand their boundaries and develop a sense of power and independence which will develop in later life.

Items to bring into Pre-school

Please limit the items which are brought into Pre-school. Regrettably no unnecessary items, including toys, can be brought into the setting as they may get lost. Children will need a named water bottle and lunch box. Please ensure clothing is named and cleaned daily. Bottles must contain WATER ONLY. We follow a Healthy Eating policy; children will be required to eat sandwiches, fruit & yogurt before eating any treats. Chocolate bars should be kept to a minimum.

We do not allow sweets at all and we have a NO nut policy (this includes chocolate spreads).
