
Please make sure you check it on a regular basis. We encourage all parents to contribute to Tapestry by adding your own comments and photos.



Sharing a book with your child is a great way to bond, plus it helps build important early literacy skills, such as listening, growing vocabulary and understanding. You can help by looking together at the pictures and pointing out a few things – ask your child to turn the page or point to the flowers for example.

Encourage your child with questions and respond to what they say. Help your child expand their thoughts by asking "wh" questions, such as "Where is the dog?' or 'What does a dog say?" Don't forget, it's okay to be silly and playful and know that your child may only interact with a few pages of the book at a time. You'll be surprised at all the talking you'll do and the fun you'll have together!

Items to bring into Pre-school

Please limit the items which are brought into Pre-school. Regrettably no unnecessary items, including toys, can be brought into the setting as they may get lost. Children will need a named water bottle and lunch box. Please ensure clothing is named and cleaned daily. Bottles must contain WATER ONLY. We follow a Healthy Eating policy; children will be required to eat sandwiches, fruit & yogurt before eating any treats. Chocolate bars should be kept to a minimum.

We do not allow sweets at all.

We have a NO NUT policy (this includes chocolate spreads) as we have children in the Preschool with severe nut allergies.
